Theologians Debate the Trinity

Scholars have debated the Trinity for centuries, but a new twist has come to the debates, where conservatives and Classical Theologians mainly with Calvinists leanings (and others) are tying the submissiveness of women to the Trinity—all based upon how Jesus the Son is eternally submissive to the Father. The advocates claim it is crystal clear, and the critics call it bad theology. This has largely been debated in the Evangelical Theological Society (ETS), the largest and most respected society of Christian conservatives in the world (with lots SBC Seminary professors as full members and officers) their most recent meeting (2006, I believe). To be a member, one has to agree to the Trinity and authority of the Bible.

Bruce Ware, professor of Christian Theology at Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, said, "There is a relationship of authority and submission in the very Godhead on the basis of which the other authority-submission relationships of Christ and man, and man and woman depend," in his paper, "Equal in Essence, Distinct in Roles."

Australian Theologian Kevin Giles disputed Ware in his paper, "The Father and the Son: Divided or Undivided Power and Authority." Giles said, "The Father and the Son do not related to one another in exactly the same way as a man and a woman might do, and so suggest so is bad theology." Giles noted that the suggestion that Jesus is eternally subordinate in authority denies he has the same power and essence as God and the Holy Spirit. The debate has spawned a minor controversy. The Council on Biblical Manhood and Womanhood believes men have leadership roles in the church and home, and Christians for Biblical Equality promotes "gift-based" rather than gender-based ministry.

Mimi Haddad is president of the equality group and brought scholars together to discuss at the ETS meeting. She said, "The reformulation of the Trinity by gender hierarchicalists is utterly astounding and clearly (unorthodox) theologically."

Wayne Grudem, founder of The Council on Biblical Manhood and Womanhood, said, "The fundamental bedrock ... principle of egalitarianism is: 'You can't be both equal and different. You can't be equal in value and different in roles.'... That's their deep-seated conviction, and I'm saying: 'Yes, you can. The Trinity proves it."

Giles argues that the proponents of Jesus' eternal subordination to God the Father are guilty of Arian heresy, a fourth century teaching that denied the full divinity of Christ, even denying an element of the ETS standards on the Trinity being "one in essence, equal in power and glory." Haddad challenged Grudem's stand as "one of the most heterodox statements I've ever heard. ... Members of the Trinity are coequal in power, authority, majesty and dominion."

I am an archeologist, but if I were to write a book about brain surgery, you would say, 'Who is this guy?' People want signs and wonders. Projects like these make a mockery of the archeological profession."²

"There is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner that repenteth." Luke 15:10



Oh, poor, disconsolate mourner, Christ remembers thee every hour. Thy sighs are his sighs; thy groans are his groans; thy prayers are his prayers:—

"He in his measure feels afresh, What every member bears."

Crucified he is when thou art crucified; he dies when thou diest; thou livest in him, and he lives in thee, and because he lives shalt thou live also: thou shalt rise in him, and thou shalt sit together in the heavenly places with him. Oh, never was husband nearer to his wife, and never head nearer to the members, and never soul nearer to the body of this flesh, than Christ is unto thee, and while it is so, think not that heaven and earth are divided.
