We left chapter 6 ... hoping

Hoping the Corinthian Church would accept Paul

First problem was to kick out a man bedding his stepmother

Then, in 6:12-20 ... Paul PLEADED that they NOT

Visit Prostitutes

reality of which was they ought NOT to

Visit Young Sex Slaves

NEVERMORE

Did Corinth REALLY ask about all these things from chapters 7-16? ...

Let me remind you ... leaving chapter 6 ugliness Paul now says,



CSB Quarterly said

"It is good for a man not to use a woman for sex"

Why "not to use" ... when v. 2 essentially says Have Sex





See how others Translate:

NIV & ESV good for a man not to have

sexual relations with a woman

HCSB good for a man not to have

relations with a woman

KJV & NASB good for a man

not to touch a woman

What is Paul saying here? ... ah, look at 7:7


⁷ I wish that all of you were as I am.

7:1 LITERALLY – says ... in Greek

Good a Man, a Woman Not Touch


7:1 uses the same Greek word as in Luke 6:19

"people all tried to TOUCH him, because power was coming from him and healing them all"

CLEARLY ... the context BEFORE & AFTER 7:1

Clearly implies Sexual Touching ...

What is Paul Saying?





Should be pretty obvious by now ...

Paul is saying ... or rather ...

Paul rather simply said:


Good a Man & a Woman NOT touch

Da da dat's all folks ...

Sex causes more problems than it's worth.

Yes, be committed ...

but what does Paul say?





Addressing their questions in chapters 7-16:

Is this then Their Question? Or His Answer?

Good a Man & a Woman NOT touch

Some tend to it as their QUESTION, as if some in Corinth were staying AWAY from ALL Sex

That's a tad weird ... and unlikely given context

If Paul's ANSWER ... better FIT to context

Fits better Chapter 6 ugliness & rest of Chapter 7

Also fits better the "self-control" Paul drives home

"Self-Control" – Major Theme thru chapters 7-16

Nobody's ever seen it, but it's got the WHOLE WORLD SHOOK UP.

they call the Love Bug....



Well I was walking all around with my head held way up high, And it fooled me ... hit me ... really took me by surprise.

Oh that little bitty teeny weeny thing they call the Love Bug.

Nobody's ever seen it,

but it's got the whole world shook up.

Paul may have been married ... even likely

Common for Jewish men to marry early ...

Maybe he was a widower ... be nice to know

But Paul enters his discussion at 7:2

² But since sexual immorality is occurring, each man should have sexual relations with his own wife, and each woman with her own husband.

STRANGE is this: Paul appears to say,

Have Marital Sex BECAUSE of Immorality

No Mystery there Some men just

FAIL



Nothing hard about 7:2 ... and following verses

except this: Does Paul REALLY say?

Because of PORN ... Have Married Sex

In light of chapter 6, chapter 7 does argue:

Paul very clearly argues to MARRY ... if, if

You Can't Keep Your Tunic On

Really? ... oh, YES ...

and Paul gets explicit



³ The husband should fulfill his marital duty to his wife, & likewise the wife to her husband.

Furthermore ... BE HUMANE ... yield

⁴ The wife does not have authority over her own body but yields it to her husband.

In the same way, the husband does not have authority over his own body but yields it to his wife.

What a beautiful way to give respect to each other More to this than meets the eye ... and HEART






Paul is recognizing a great drive ... for intimacy In chapter 7 ... Self-Control is given Star Power Read the chapter ... Paul favors abstinence In Chapter 6 Paul prohibited

- Incest
- Using young sex slaves

Chapter 7 ... Marriage—only proper avenue for sex

Paul encourages a Mutual Respect ... as though that

Mutual Respect may NOT have been going on ...



⁵ Do not deprive each other except perhaps by mutual consent and for a time,

so that you may devote yourselves to prayer.

Then come together again so that Satan will not tempt you because of your lack of self-control.

⁶ I say this as a concession, not as a command.

Paul empowers women here ...

Married Sex is for BOTH



Furthermore ... do not ... do NOT let this slip

I gather some do not like to say it ... bluntly

Marriage is for Sex

or

Need Sex? ... GET MARRIED

Procreation is ... well ... not mentioned

In God's inspired WORD ... we have what we have all known since puberty ...

SEX Drives us Bonkers

Paul drops a bombshell ...

⁷ I wish that all of you were as I am.

But each of you has your own GIFT from God;

one has this GIFT, another has that.

Really Paul? GIFT? ... What "GIFT"?

Reality is ... hold on to your hat Mabeline ...

Reality is ... no one ... NO ONE ...

No one WANTS to be like Paul

Well maybe not a BOMBSHELL ...

⁷ I wish that all of you were as I am.

This & other verses HAVE led to HERMITISM

There ARE those who have felt the "Call"

Catholic Church celibacy rules Priests

Monks & Nuns have separated themselves for centuries

Outside the "Call" to exclusive ministry ...

No one WANTS to be like Paul





7:8-9 Marriage & Singleness – Stay Single, if No Control

No ONE wants to be alone ... I think Paul knows

8 Now to the unmarried and the widows I say: It is good for them to stay unmarried, as I do.

⁹ But if they CANNOT control themselves, they should marry, for it is better to marry than to burn with passion.

Forget the fact the older you get the easier it is to do without ... remember

Paul, 7:1 ... Good NOT to Touch!

BETTER ... Paul says, to remain as he does

BETTER ... to do without sex ...

Paul's meaning is not that hard to grasp. \subset

For the sake of the Kingdom ... abstain.

Yet ... Paul knows ... most are NOT like him.

Most will NOT be like Paul ... and in fact

Most do NOT WANT to Live without Sex





Therefore, perhaps in answer to the Corinthians

10 To the married I give this command (not I, but the Lord):

A wife must NOT separate from her husband.

¹¹ But if she does, she must remain unmarried or else be reconciled to her husband.

And a husband must NOT divorce his wife.

MUST NOT ... DIVORCE ... heavy terms.

Most understand this: Marriage is for Life





From there ... Paul wings it ...

12 To the rest I say this (I, not the Lord):
If any brother has a wife who is not a believer and she is willing to live with him,
he must NOT divorce her.

¹³ And if a woman has a husband who is not a believer and he is willing to live with her, she must NOT divorce him.

Here is a tender consideration ... not obvious





IF ... IF ... IF they are willing? ... What is that?

he ... she must NOT divorce ...


Burden of staying married to an unbeliever rests with the "willingness" of the unbeliever.

If the unbelieving DOES NOT ... want to stay?

Go ahead and divorce???

These are not easy ...

And I venture not easy for Paul either ...





Paul then tosses in Spouse sanctification

14 For the unbelieving husband has been sanctified through his wife,

and the unbelieving wife has been sanctified through her believing husband.

Otherwise your children would be unclean, but as it is, they are holy.

What is that?




Unbeliever SANCTIFIED by the Believer?

Same root word used in 7:14 is used in 1:2

² To the church of God which is at Corinth, to those who have been SANCTIFIED in Christ Jesus

Of all things ... it does NOT mean the unbeliever will be SAVED to eternal life.

"Sanctified" in 7:14 refers to the MARRIAGE





Paul helps us ... freeing the believer to remarry if the unbeliever leaves ...

¹⁵ But if the unbeliever leaves, let it be so.
 The brother or the sister is not bound in such circumstances;
 God has called us to live in peace.

16 How do you know, wife, whether you will SAVE your husband?

Or, how do you know, husband, whether you will SAVE your wife?



So then ... Paul himself confirms ... the unbelieve *M I G H T* be SAVED through the piety & Christian life of the BELIEVING spouse

Here is the JEWEL of the "sanctified" passage

MARRIAGE itself becomes a VALID marriage under God ... as the two become one flesh

Catholic Church makes Marriage a Sacrament

An actual Vehicle of Grace & Blessing FROM God okay, then what is the JEWEL you say?







Percy Sledge was an orderly at the Colbert County Hospital during the days

A singer with Lewis & Wright in a band at night


Colbert County Hospital ... renamed

Helen Keller Hospital in 1979

Sledge, very sad one night over a WOMAN he loved

Overcome with emotion, Percy Sledge asked bass player Calvin Lewis and organ player Andrew Wright to play a slow blues
