Quick Review – Joshua and Judges to Samuel

- **3,000 years before Samuel**
- Tabernacle with Ark of Covenant resides at Shiloh from Joshua's conquest
- Philistines oppress Israel, monopoly on iron – Samson began relief
- Samuel the kingmaker anoints
 Saul and David full relief



- ✓ Samuel the last best Judge about 1100 B.C.
- After Solomon's death, all falls apart ... again

2:12-36 Eli's sons scoundrels – Samuel blessed – Eli's end Back at Shiloh – Shambala Party Time Vs. 12 NIV: Eli's sons were scoundrels, no regard for the Lord!

- Exceedingly stressful for Eli for any father
- Eli was the grandson of Aaron, yes, the older brother of Moses
- ✓ Eli was the grandson of AARON—the first High Priest of Israelites
- Two Generations from Egypt and the Wilderness Wandering
- One Generation from the Conquest of Joshua
- Eli grew up with Joshua's sons and stories of conquest
- Eli's sons Hophni and Phineas , the latter an Egyptian name, they grew up in privilege under Eli of the Great House of Aaron



Well, I'm here to tell you now, each and every mother's son, That you better learn it fast, you better learn it young, 'Cause someday never comes. For Eli ... I imagine, he hoped they would learn ... Someday ... However, "someday" never came If you read 2:12-36, Eli's sons SHAMED Israel! especially the House of Aaron and the Tabernacle



though not clearly said in the Bible, some verses indicate the "tent" tabernacle was made a permanent structure at Shiloh ... at some time










2:12-36 Eli's sons scoundrels - Samuel blessed - Eli's end **Back at Shiloh – Shambhala vs. Samuel** Vs. 12: Eli's sons were scoundrels, no regard for the Lord! 2:13-17 – their "sin was very great in the Lords' sight" curious drama in Chapter 2 ... back and forth on Eli and Samuel 2:18-21 – "But Samuel ministered" – Hannah gave him a new coat every year – and Eli blessed 2:21 – LORD gracious to Hannah, 3 sons and 2 daughters. best of all, "Samuel grew up in the presence of the LORD." 2:22-25 – Eli grieves over his evil sons sad for any ... especially for a pastor 2:26 – Samuel grew in stature & favor with the LORD and with people. **2:27-36** – Man of God gives Eli prophecy of doom for his family part of Eli's judgment from of his failure to FIX his sons

¹ The boy Samuel ministered before the LORD under Eli. In those days the word of the LORD was rare; there were not many visions.

Rare ... in those days – what? the word of the LORD was RARE *plus* ... not many visions

Amos 1:1 – vision he saw ... two years before the earthquake "LORD roars from Zion ... thunders from Jerusalem Micah 1:1 – Word of LORD ... vision concerning Samaria & Jerusalem Isaiah 2:1 – What Isaiah ... saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem 3:1-10 A Voice - Samuel hears God speak in those days the word of the LORD was RARE *plus* ... not many visions What is the "Word of the Lord" for today?

Bible ... Pastors ... Church ... God's Spirit Teaching



Church is God's work in Christ on earth today *People of God's Church*

3:1-10 A Voice - Samuel hears God speak in those days - Shiloh was dark

² One night Eli, whose eyes were becoming so weak that he could barely see, was lying down in his usual place.

- Way back then, DON'T underestimate the power of the priest! unlike today's pastors, Eli had considerably more power then
- Priest ruled ... and would anoint a king ... think about Dark Ages
- ✓ Dark Ages after Fall of Rome reflected O.T. & N.T. RULE of priest

However ... a mother, Hannah, dedicated her dear son, **Samuel**, to God to be a Nazarite

2:12-36 Eli's sons scoundrels – Samuel blessed – Eli's end Nazarite Vow

From "nazir" – meaning consecrated or separated

- Numbers 6:2-21 gives rules of essentially three-fold vow:
 - 1. No wine of any kind or even non-fermented grapes
 - 2. No cutting hair
 - 3. No contact with corpses or graves
- Made by verbal declaration: "I am a Nazarite for 1 yr" or "forever"
- Three kinds of Nazarite:
 - 1. Set time, after which one gives several offerings & shaves head but if temple is not there, de facto permanent
 - 2. Permanent "I am a Nazarite for life"
 - 3. Like Samson "I am a Nazarite like Samson"

2:12-36 Eli's sons scoundrels – Samuel blessed – Eli's end Nazarite Vow

None before Samson in the Bible, but seems evident before Moses

Only three in Scripture who were Nazarites

- 1. Samson in Judges 13:4
- 2. Samuel in 1 Samuel 1:11
- 3. John the Baptist in Luke 1:15

 Paul took Nazarite vow in Acts 21, as it was allowed for one to "join others" in their vow





Eli going blind? ... or ... Israel losing divine light?




Lamp of God had not yet gone out

Literally – refers to Tabernacle Light

No indication IN THE BIBLE it refers to anything else ... no where




Yet ... for us, N.T. believers, we CAN'T HELP OURSELVES we see IMMEDIATE relevance all through the New Testament
Yet, at Shiloh 3,000 years ago ... they were just starting ...
Back to Lamp lighting in O.T.: Ex. 27:20, 30:7-8, Lev. 24:1-4

Lamp of God had not yet gone out


Ex. 27:20, "Command the Israelites to bring you clear oil of pressed olives for the light so that the lamps may be kept burning." (*in Tabernacle*)

Light would go out before dawn



Ex. 30:7-8, "Aaron must burn fragrant incense on the altar every morning when he tends the lamps. He must burn incense again when he lights the lamps at twilight so incense will burn regularly before the LORD for the generations to come."

Lamp of God had not yet gone out **Tree blooming FULL of N. T. metaphors and similes** John 12:46 – I have come into the world as a light Acts 13:47 – I have made you a light for the Gentiles **Romans 2:19 – a light for those who are in the dark Romans 13:12 – put on the armor of light** Ephesians 5:9 – fruit of the light consists in all goodness ... and truth **Colossians 1:12 – qualified you to share in the inheritance ...** in the kingdom of light ... and many, many more

So many have seen so much in song & poem Eli going blind? ... oh, not really

Israel losing divine light? ... yes, possible

Yes, all those and much, much more COULD be seen

What DOES take place ... is ... passing of the light to ...

See the Aggadah, i.e., Jewish lore, stories in Talmud or Midrash Talmud – Rabbinic Literature from A.D. 200 Midrash – Commentary on Torah

"Before the sun of Eli set, the sun of Samuel rose"

Then the LORD called Samuel. Samuel answered, "Here I am."

- ⁵ He ran to Eli and said, "Here I am; you called me." But Eli said, "I did not call; go back and lie down." So he went and lay down.
- ⁶ Again the LORD called, "Samuel!" And Samuel got up and went to Eli and said, "Here I am; you called me." "My son," Eli said, "I did not call; go back and lie down."
- ⁷ Now Samuel did not YET know the LORD: The word of the LORD had not YET been revealed to him.

A third time the LORD called, "Samuel!" And Samuel got up and went to Eli and said, "Here I am; you called me." Then Eli realized that the LORD was calling the boy.

⁹ So Eli told Samuel, "Go and lie down, and if he calls you, say, 'Speak, LORD, for your servant is listening.'" So Samuel went and lay down in his place.

¹⁰ The LORD came and stood there, calling as at the other times, "Samuel! Samuel!" Then Samuel said, "Speak, for your servant is listening."

3:11-16 Lord gives bad news about Eli – Samuel afraid

Lord tells Samuel BAD NEWS

¹¹ LORD said to Samuel: "See, I am about to do something in Israel that will make the ears of everyone who hears about it tingle.

¹² At that time I will carry out against Eli everything I spoke against his family—from beginning to end.

¹³ For I told him that I would judge his family forever because of the sin he knew about; his sons blasphemed God, and he failed to restrain them. 3:11-16 Lord gives bad news about Eli – Samuel afraid

Lord SWORE to Eli – BAD NEWS

¹⁴ Therefore I swore to the house of Eli, 'The guilt of Eli's house will never be atoned for by sacrifice or offering.' "

¹⁵ Samuel lay down until morning and then

opened the doors of the house of the LORD.

He was afraid to tell Eli the vision - xes ... Samuel was the Doorman in the House of the Lord

¹⁶ but Eli called him and said, "Samuel, my son." Samuel answered, "Here I am."

3:17-18 A Message – Samuel tells Eli message

Do Not Hide It from Me – hmmm

¹⁷ "What was it he said to you?" Eli asked. "Do not hide it from me.

Eli seems to be a man of integrity ... somewhat

May God deal with you, be it ever so severely, if you hide from me anything he told you."

¹⁸ So Samuel told him everything, hiding nothing from him.

Then Eli said,

"He is the LORD; let him do what is good in his eyes." Samuel ... Doorman in the House of the Lord Inherits and becomes the Lamp of the Lord for Israel

3:19-21 **A Prophet – Samuel grew, Lord with him, all knew** Verse 19 The LORD was with Samuel as he grew up, and he let none of Samuel's words fall to the ground. **God let NONE of Samuel's** words fall to the ground! becomes the LAMP of the Lord


- Greatness to Samuel not given ANY other king or prophet
- V No one EVER challenged his authority
- Refused compensation & travelled to people on circuit
- Five terms of praise were applied to Samuel
 - 1. Faithful 2. Honored 3. Prophet
 - 4. Seer 5. Man of God

3:19-21 A Prophet – Samuel grew, L

Samuel Grew ¹⁹ LORD was with Samuel ... none of his words fell to ground. ²⁰ All Israel from **Dan to Beersheba** recognized that Samuel was attested as a prophet of the LORD.

> from Dan to Beersheba about 150 miles as the bird flies



3:19-21 A Prophet – Samuel grew, Lord with him, all knew Samuel Grew **Verse 21** The LORD continued to appear at Shiloh, and there He – GOD – revealed Himself to Samuel through His word.
