

1 Samuel

A Key Verse 15:22

Samuel replied:

"Does the LORD delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices as much as in obeying the LORD?

To obey is better than sacrifice, and to heed is better than the fat of rams."



13:1-23 Saul Faces Philistines, Botches Offering

NIV – 13:1 Saul was 30 years old when he became king, and he reigned over Israel 42 years. << oldest texts "2 years"

'tis a Mystery Verse - "2-yr reign" doubtful

No one REALLY knows how OLD Saul was or how LONG he reigned


- ✓ KJV, "Saul reigned one year; and when he had reigned two years over"
- ✓ NIV used LXX for "30 years old"
- ✓ NASB says Saul reigned 32 years
- ✓ JPS says Saul reigned 2 years
- ✓ NRSV says Saul reigned 2? Years
- ✓ Acts 13:21 and Josephus' Antiquities both say Saul reigned 40 years
- ✓ Best Texts have "2" clearly for reign Context CLEARLY indicates MORE

- **ü** No original autographs
- Some intimate that "2-yr reign"
 was meant to be facetious,
 in that God rejected Saul
 early in his reign
- ü Jonathan commanded 1,000, Saul had a grandson when he died on Mt. Gilboa (ch 31)


- ³ Jonathan attacks

- ⁴ Israel becomes obnoxious to Philistines



13:1-23 Saul Faces Philistines, Botches Offering

- ⁵ Philistines 3,000 chariots, 6,000 charioteers, and so "soldiers as numerous as the sand on the seashore!"
- ⁷ Saul remained at Gilgal ... troops were "quaking with fear."
- ⁸ He waited seven days, the time set by Samuel; but Samuel did not come to Gilgal, and Saul's men began to scatter.
- ⁹ Saul makes offering
- ¹¹ Samuel rebukes Saul and Saul explains ...

Saul seems reasonable




13:1-11 Saul Faces Philistines, Botches Offering

Not a blacksmith could be found in the whole land of Israel, because the Philistines had said, "Otherwise the Hebrews will make swords or spears!" ²⁰ So all Israel went down to the Philistines to have their plow points, mattocks, axes and sickles sharpened.

Philistines had Monopoly on Iron

Ancient Canaanite & Philistine straight swords





13:1-11 Saul Faces Philistines, Botches Offering

²¹ Two-thirds of a shekel for sharpening plow points and mattocks, and a third of a shekel for sharpening forks and axes and for repointing goads.
Shekel = about 4/10 of oz. – meaning of word is "to weigh"
Used in Akkadian Empire of 2100 B.C. and Code of Hammurabi 1700 B.C.



silver Jerusalem Shekel (AD 68)
First Jewish Revolt x Roman rule.
inscription "Shekel of Israel / Year 3"
reverse "Jerusalem the Holy".



Israel's Shekel today worth 26 cents in U.S.

When I went there in 1982, exchange was 26 Shekels to dollar





Wady Suweinit – valley of little thorn tree, acacia






1 Samuel Intro

Judges to Samuel to Saul's Death Ark at Kiriath Jearim

David fights Amalekites at Ziglag, as Saul battles Philistines at Mt. Gilboa, dying there c. 1010 B.C.

²³ Detachment of Philistines had gone out to the pass at Mikmash.

14:1-52 Two and Half Narratives

Chapter 14 – Two Main Narratives

ONE: 14:1-15 – Story of Jonathan and his Armor Bearer's Bravery

Two: 14:16-52 – Sad story of Saul's abuse – as Jonathan's victory causing confusion in Philistines, and Saul's curse backfires.

As All This Unfolds—Notice

- ✓ Saul appears to lose all concern over the well-being of his troops
- ✓ Saul appears to NOT have complete control
- √ Jonathan has an independent spirit of fearlessness, akin to David's
- ✓ Jonathan appears to be ONE HECK of a fighting man

- ¹ One day Jonathan ... said to his young armor-bearer, "Come, let's go over to the Philistine outpost on the other side." ... did not tell his father.
- ² Saul ... Gibeah under a pomegranate tree in Migron.... 600 men. No one was aware that Jonathan had left.
- ⁴ On each side of the pass that Jonathan intended to cross to reach the Philistine outpost was a cliff; one called Bozez and the other Seneh. ⁵ One cliff stood to the north toward Mikmash, other to the south toward Geba.
- ⁶ Jonathan said to his young armor-bearer, "Come, let's go over to the outpost of those uncircumcised men. Perhaps the LORD will act in our behalf.

 Nothing can hinder the LORD from saving, whether by many or by few."
- ⁷ "Do all that you have in mind," his armor-bearer said.

"Go ahead; I am with you heart and soul."

ww-Whhaattt? ... "PERHAPS the Lord will..."

⁸ Jonathan said, "Come on, then; we will cross over toward them and let them see us.

⁹ If they say to us, 'Wait there until we come to you,' we will stay where we are and not go up to them.

¹⁰ But if they say, 'Come up to us,' we will climb up, because that will be our sign that the LORD has given them into our hands."

What Kind of SIGN is THAT?




¹¹ So they showed themselves to the Philistine outpost. "Look!" said the Philistines. "The Hebrews are crawling out of the holes they were hiding in."


¹² The men of the outpost shouted to Jonathan and his armor-bearer, "Come up to us and we'll teach you a lesson." So Jonathan said to his armor-bearer,

"Climb up after me; the LORD has given them into the hand of Israel."

¹³ Jonathan climbed up, using his hands and feet, with his armorbearer right behind him. The Philistines fell before Jonathan, and his armorbearer followed and killed behind him.







14:14 In that first attack Jonathan and his armor-bearer killed some twenty men in an area of about half an acre.

Who is this man Jonathan?

Little to nothing about the back story or his history

a fool or a drunk might chance similar but by the time they descended and ascended the two hills, he would have sobered up

a man of Superior Faith in God

Who knew or heard of the Great Samson it's possible Jonathan as a little boy had met Samson

Jonathan was more honorable than his father

After Jonathan whipped Philistine Outpost above the Wady Suweinit

¹⁵ Then panic struck the whole army—those in the camp and field, and those in the outposts and raiding parties—and the ground shook.

14:15 - "It was a panic sent by God."

¹⁶ Saul's lookouts at Gibeah in Benjamin saw the army melting away in all directions. ¹⁷ Saul musters forces ... The tumult in the Philistine camp increased more and more.

²² When all the Israelites **HIDDEN** in the hill country of Ephraim heard that the Philistines were on the run, they joined the battle in hot pursuit.

²³ On that day the LORD saved Israel, and the battle moved on beyond Beth Aven.

14:1-52 Saul's Curse Backfires

14:26-25 Israelites in distress ... because Saul had bound the people under an oath, saying, "Cursed be anyone who eats ... before I've avenged myself!"

^{14:27} In the woods, Jonathan not heard the oath, so using his staff, he it into the honeycomb, raised his hand to his mouth, and his eyes brightened.

Saul casted lots and Jonathan implicated ... Jonathan MUST DIE!

14:45 But the men said to Saul, "Should Jonathan die—he who has brought

about this great deliverance in Israel? Never!
As surely as the LORD lives, not a hair of his head will fall to the ground, for he did this today with God's help." So the men rescued Jonathan, and he was not put to death.

14:46-52 All the days of Saul there was bitter war with the Philistines, and whenever Saul saw a mighty or brave man, he took him into his service.



David and Saul

15:1-9 Saul's Disobedience

^{15:1-6} Samuel tells Saul, "LORD Almighty says: 'I will punish the Amalekites for what they did to Israel when they waylaid them as they came up from Egypt.

³ Now go, attack the Amalekites and totally destroy all that belongs to them. Do not spare them; put to death men and women, children and infants, cattle and sheep, camels and donkeys.'

4-5 Saul musters 200k at Telaim.... Set ambush in ravine near Amalek [debate 200k ... likely several years after chap. 14]

⁶ Saul told Kenites to leave so he would not destroy them too.




15:1-9 Saul's Disobedience

⁷ Saul attacked the Amalekites all the way from Havilah to Shur,

near the eastern border of Egypt.

Amalekites – descendants of Amalek son of Eliphaz, grandson of Esau

- ✓ Originated in Edom
- ✓ From Egypt, Ex. 17, God gave water for Israel by Moses rock striking
- ✓ Amalekites savagely attack Israel
- ✓ Cursed in Ex. 17:14 & Deut. 25:19 God will "Blot out the memory"
- ✓ Later, while David fights Amalekites.
 Saul dies fighting Philistines



15:1-9 Saul's Disobedience


⁷ Saul attacked the Amalekites all the way from Havilah to Shur,

near the eastern border of Egypt.

⁸ He took Agag king of the Amalekites alive, and all his people he totally destroyed with the sword.

⁹ But Saul and the army spared Agag and the best of the sheep and cattle, the fat calves and lambs everything that was good.

But everything that despised and weak was destroyed.



¹⁰ Word of the LORD came to Samuel:

In "I regret that I have made Saul king, because he has turned away from me and has not carried out my instructions."

Samuel was angry, and he cried out to the LORD all that night.




¹⁰ Word of the LORD came to Samuel:

Carmel – Saul's Monument victory over Amalekites


Joshua 15:55 – Carmel is one of 103 towns/villages within given "border" of Judah

For Perspective


Larger than Tyler County, Judah goes farther down into Amalekite territory


Carmel - Monument to victory over Amalekites

- ✓ Joshua 15:55 Carmel is one of 103 towns/ villages within the given "border" of Judah
- ✓ 1 Sam. 25, home of Nabal and wife Abigail
- ✓ 2 Chron. 27, King Uzziah had vineyards there
- ✓ Then in Joshua 15:63, we read something exceedingly INFORMATIVE:

"Judah could not dislodge the Jebusites, who were living in Jebus (Jerusalem); to this day the Jebusites live there with the people of Judah."

Hint: Want to unite Israel & found a capitol? Find a central city no one else could subdue!

hint, hint, hint ... King David on the way



¹³ When Samuel reached him, Saul said, "The LORD bless you! I have carried out the LORD's instructions."

What a politician he has become ... or TRIED to become now Samuel is not buying it ... Grandpa KNOWS better

¹⁴ But Samuel said, "What then is this bleating of sheep in my ears? What is this lowing of cattle I hear?"

15 Saul answered, "The soldiers brought them from the Amalekites; they spared the best of the sheep and cattle to sacrifice to the LORD your God, but we totally destroyed the rest."



15:16-23 God's Rejection – Obey Better than Sacrifice

¹⁶ "Enough!" Samuel said to Saul. "Let me tell you what the LORD said to me last night."

GULP, GULP "Tell me," Saul replied.

You sniveling rascal

Do you REALLY think I am like one of your little fawning lobbyists?

¹⁷⁻¹⁸ Samuel said, "Though once small in your own eyes ... The LORD anointed you king.... sent you to, 'Completely destroy ... Amalekites.'

What part of COMPLETELY DESTROY did you NOT understand?

15:16-23 God's Rejection – Obey Better than Sacrifice GULP, GULPUPITY, GULP, GULP

²⁰⁻²¹ "But I DID obey the LORD," Saul said. "I ... completely destroyed the Amalekites and brought back Agag their king. ²¹ The soldiers took sheep, cattle ... the best ... to sacrifice them to the LORD ... at Gilgal."

Blame the soldiers - you sniveler

- ²² But Samuel replied: "Does the LORD delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices as much as in obeying the LORD? To obey is better than sacrifice, and to heed is better than the fat of rams.
- ²³ For rebellion is like the sin of divination, and arrogance like the evil of idolatry. Because you have rejected the word of the LORD, he has rejected you as king."

15:24-35 Samuel Kills Agag - Good Bye to Saul

²⁴⁻²⁵ Saul repents, afraid of his men, begs Samuel.

²⁶⁻²⁸ Samuel rejects, Saul accidently tears Samuel's garment, Samuel declares that "The LORD has torn the kingdom of Israel from you today."

15:29 He who is the Glory of Israel does not lie or change his mind; for he is not a human being, that he should change his mind."

- ³⁰⁻³¹ Saul repents again, asks for honor.... So Samuel went back with Saul.
- ³²⁻³³ Samuel curses Saul and kills King Agag of the Amalekites at Gilgal.
- ³⁴ Samuel left for Ramah, but Saul went up to his home in Gibeah of Saul.
- ³⁵ Until the day Samuel died, he did not go to see Saul again, though Samuel mourned for him. And the LORD regretted that he had made Saul king over Israel.
