

Exodus 14 links back to Genesis 50 where Joseph wanted to be buried at home One of the more outstanding O.T. passages ¹⁹ But Joseph said to them ...

²⁰ You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done.... ²²⁻²³ Joseph stayed in Egypt.... lived 110 years.... ²⁴ Then Joseph said to his brothers, "I am about to die. But God will surely come to your aid and take you up out of this land to the land he promised on oath to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob." Genesis 50:25 ²⁵ And Joseph made the Israelites swear an OATH and said, "God will surely come to your aid, and then you must CARRY MY BONES UP FROM THIS PLACE."

²⁶ So Joseph died at the age of a 110.

In Book of Joshua,

after the conquest,

Joseph was buried in Shechem

After more on the Passover ... grabbing the bones of Joseph ... dedicating their firstborn in Exodus 13:1-16 ... Exodus 13:17 ... God led by **Pillar of Cloud by Day Pillar of Fire by Night NOT the coastal route through the land of Philistines** But they go south ... Exodus 13:20, And they moved on from Succoth and encamped at Etham, on the edge of the wilderness. Etham means "solid or enduring" If you want GREAT detail ... go to Numbers 33 for every stop



Numbers 33 relates a tad more on our travels today

- ² At the LORD's command, Moses recorded the stages in their journey ...
- ³⁻⁴ The Israelites set out from Rameses ... They marched out defiantly in full view of all the Egyptians, who were burying all their firstborn....
- ⁵ The Israelites left Raameses and camped at Sukkoth.
- ⁶ They left Sukkoth and camped at Etham, on the edge of the desert.
- ⁷ They left Etham, turned back to Pi Hahiroth, to the east of Baal Zephon, and camped near Migdol.

⁸ They left Pi Hahiroth and passed through the SEA into the desert,

... traveled for three days ... camped at Marah.

Term for "Red Sea" is not in Chap. 14, LOOK SEE What term us used for SEA—see? ... See the Sea

14:2, "Tell the Israelites to turn back and encamp near Pi Hahiroth, between Migdol and the SEA.

Hebrew word: hay-yam = the SEA



Same word in 14:16, where Moses raised his staff ... over the SEA to divide the water so that the Israelites can go through the SEA on dry ground.

Same in 14:21, Then Moses stretched out his hand over the SEA, and all that night the LORD drove the SEA back with a strong east wind and turned it into dry land. The waters were divided ...

You might think ... WOW ... where does "Red Sea" come from? They camped at Pi Hahiroth ... then crossed the Red Sea—look see

"Let my people go"


"Red Sea" translates the Hebrew Yam Suph **Red Sea is huge ... over 1,400 miles long ... Compare the size of Texas** Yam Suph – literally: "Sea Red" or "Red Sea" Yam Suph is a woolly seaweed tossed ashore **Pi Hahiroth = means "where reeds grow"** some then refer to "Reed Sea" **Greeks called it "Red Sea" – origin uncertain** Some think because of the "red" mountains on, western shore ... or red coral in its salty sea **Obviously ... Hebrews did not cross 200-mile part of Red Sea**



Here is a closer look Gulf of Suez on left Gulf of Aquba on right

After Alexander the Great died, his General Ptolemy inherited Egypt and his descendants made a canal from Bitter Lakes to Suez

There is some reference, too, to ancient pharaohs building canals c. 1800 B.C.!






Your map helps out a lot Yet there is confusion, or simply—No One KNOWS



1st Red Sea / Yam Suph: Ex. 10:19 8th Plague of Locusts in 10:1-20 God drives the locust out to Yam Suph, to the Red Sea Pharaoh is in Raamses ... and **Hebrews leave from Raamses** Where are the locusts sent? Ex. 14:2, "Tell the Israelites to turn back and encamp near Pi Hahiroth, between **Migdol and the SEA.** Looking at this Migdol Harder ... making the "sea" the Mediterranean and no sense



Ex. 14:2 they are at Pi Hahiroth In Numbers 33:8, very clearly they are in Pi Hahiroth and ... Place of "where reeds grow" Likely that Pi Hahiroth is near Suez today ... importantly ... they leave from Pi Hahiroth to cross the Red Sea Likely, the TIP of Gulf of Suez extended more NORTH in 1447 B.C. **Red Sea that God PARTED** they walked on dry ground **Between walls of water ... at night**



14:3, Pharaoh will think, "The Israelites are wandering around the land in confusion, hemmed in by the desert."

14:4, I will harden Pharaoh's heart

14:5-10, Pharaoh and all, "What have we done?"
600 of best chariots and other chariots ...
Pharaoh catches up with the Israelites ...





14:13-18 Setting – Stand Firm, See Deliverance See all this ... the former slaves fear for their lives ¹³ Moses answered the people, "Do not be afraid. Stand firm and you will see the deliverance the LORD will bring you today. The Egyptians you see today you will never see again. ¹⁴ The LORD will fight for you; you need only to be still."

That is GOOD NEWS ... hope it is TRUE

14:13-18 Setting – Stand Firm, See Deliverance

Then comes one of the most astounding miracles to date in the Bible since the Creation & Flood

¹⁵ Then the LORD said to Moses, "Why are you crying out to me? Tell the Israelites to move on.

¹⁶ Raise your staff and stretch out your hand over the sea to divide the water so that the Israelites can go through the sea on dry ground.

Yet ... Moses does NOT just yet raise his staff ... God is not through talking yet ...

God continues ...

¹⁷ I will harden the hearts of the Egyptians so that they will go in after them. And I will gain glory through Pharaoh and all his army, through his chariots and his horsemen.

¹⁸ The Egyptians will know that I am the LORD when I gain glory through Pharaoh, his chariots and his horsemen."

GLORY! So the EGYPTIANS will know ... HOW? ... when Pharaoh's army IS DROWNED! STILL ... before Moses lifts his staff

¹⁹ Then the angel of God, who had been traveling in front of Israel's army, withdrew and went behind them.

The pillar of cloud also moved from in front and stood behind them,

²⁰ coming between the armies of Egypt and Israel. Throughout the night the cloud brought darkness to the one side and light to the other side; so neither went near the other all night long.

Ahhh ... see the writer, Moses,

artfully penning the narrative

Cecil B. DeMille (1881-1959) Perhaps the greatest director of his generation Cut his teeth on making epics He made 62 silent films to 1929 Including silent Ten Commandments in 1923 King of Kings in 1927 ... a grand epic on the life of Christ - 2.5 hours ... cost \$1.5m in 1927! 29 more sound movies to 1956 ... including these The Sign of the Cross - 1932 Samson and Delilah - 1949 Cleopatra - 1934 **Greatest Show on Earth - 1952** The Crusades - 1935 The Ten Commandments - 1956

Cecil B. DeMille filmed in Egypt & Sinai In November, 1954, filming the Exodus in Egypt DeMille (73) climbed a 107-foot ladder to the top of the massive Rameses set—had heart attack Ignoring his doctor's orders, DeMille was back directing the film within a week. **DeMille completed the film ... though his health declined** And he had several more heart attacks The Ten Commandments was his last

The Ten Commandments

hit theaters in 1956 won Academy Award for Special Effects

Now notice ... something impossible to portray ... even in a movie of epic scale ²¹ Then Moses stretched out his hand over the sea, and ALL THAT NIGHT the LORD drove the sea back with a strong east wind and turned it into dry land. The waters were divided, ²² and the Israelites went through the sea on Dry Ground, with a WALL OF WATER on their **RIGHT** and on their **LEFT**. **Did you see "ALL THAT NIGHT"?** That was a mighty wind ... and those were Mighty Walls This was no Prairie Pond ... or Village Creek And they went at NIGHT

SOMEHOW ... God lifted the Gate of Passage SOMEHOW ... the Pillar of Fire was still there ... and God allowed the Egyptians through ²³ The Egyptians pursued them, and all Pharaoh's horses and chariots and horsemen followed them into the sea. ²⁴ During the last watch of the night the LORD looked down from the pillar of fire and cloud at the Egyptian army and threw it into confusion. Amazing ... God toying ... playing

Now hear this ... ²⁵ God jammed the wheels of their chariots so that they had difficulty driving. And the Egyptians said, "Let's get away from the Israelites! The LORD is fighting for them against Egypt." It's HARD to follow an insane Pharaoh Hard to obey a crazy leader Hard to go

Against God

While the Egyptians struggle ... and wonder ²⁶ Then the LORD said to Moses,

"Stretch out your hand over the sea so that the waters may flow back over the Egyptians and their chariots and horsemen."

²⁷ Moses stretched out his hand over the sea, and at daybreak the sea went back to its place. The Egyptians were fleeing toward it, and the LORD swept them into the sea.

²⁸ The water flowed back & covered the chariots & horsemen —the entire army of Pharaoh that had followed the Israelites into the sea.

Not one of them survived.

Great Deliverance

³⁰ That day the LORD saved Israel from the hands of the Egyptians, and Israel saw the Egyptians lying dead on the shore. ³¹ And when the Israelites saw the mighty hand of the LORD displayed against the Egyptians, the people feared the LORD and put their trust in him and in Moses his servant.

Over 100x in the Old Testament "Yahweh ... the one who brought you up from the land of Egypt, out of the House of Bondage" Oh, Happy Day ... Oh, Happy Day Yet, there are critics ... who scrutinize and doubt We, today, have a choice to make ... And I suspect God knew this Is the Exodus crossing REALLY that spectacular?

To the Israel ... it was GREATER than Cecil B. DeMille's epic To the soon-to-be-wandering Israelites ... much GREATER We have Exodus 15 to thank for that ... Therein, Moses clarifies in SONG & grand poetic eloquence ² "The LORD is my strength ... my father's God ... a warrior.... ⁴ Pharaoh's ... army he has hurled into the sea.... ⁵ The DEEP WATERS have covered them; they sank to the depths like a stone.... ⁸ By the blast of your nostrils the waters piled up. The surging waters stood up like a wall; the deep waters congealed in the heart of the sea.

There is no question left ... if you believe the Bible ... Clarity is driven home ... See Exodus 15:1-21 ...

Spectacular Deliverance

Critical, Pivotal Point in Israel's History WHY? Cause there is NO ... NADA ... NONE TURNING BACK You may not have had the Waters Parted But everyone here today knows SOMETHING of this Another one of those mostly ADULT-ONLY feelings Made all the greater if the Deliverance is Spectacular But you KNOW ...

> You have Crossed a Few Rivers Crossed a Few Bridges Where ... once crossed

Easy to see are those "rights of passage" in life First Car ... First Love ... First Job ... First Gun ... When you got Married ... or Divorced ... When you had a Death of a Loved One Worst ones ... don't they always come in DARK HOURS? Where the midnight of grieve crackles your bones? **Or ... perhaps ... when you SAVED a life, as a soldier** each one of these ... once crossed

But there are other *passages* ... *crossings* When you decided to KEEP QUIET at an injustice ... When you chose to TURN YOUR BACK to a crime ...

Or ... when you decided to put personal safety aside ... When you decided to risk life and limb ... When you thought hard, pondered, feared, dreaded ... And decided to take a NOBLE STAND for Truth each one of these ... once crossed

And there are precious *passages* ... crossings When you decided to commit ... promise ... You decided ... to love ... to marry ...

To have kids ... to have a family ... Therein ... you said ... to your wife ... to your husband ... This is a one-way trip ...

You said you *I love YOU* ... and *there is* ...

For Israel ... in Spectacular Deliverance I'll bet ... on the road from Succoth to Migdol to Pi Hahiroth I just *know* there were several who turned back I just *know* there were a few who said, "Too Risky!"

And at the Red Sea ... yes, several SAID THAT ... However ... once Moses raised his staff Once God sent his angel to Open the Sea ... once embarked upon ... once crossed

Most of all ... That ominous time came for Christ ... in the Garden of Gethsemane *If it be your will ... take this cup from me* Christ chose to go forth ...

In this Spectacular Deliverance ... You can BELIEVE it ... or NOT ... In fact ... and truth ... and with certainty This foreshadows the greater deliverance of Christ If one passes from this life NOT believing it **No Turning Back** Yet if one accepts ... believes ... then You have an inheritance in a more Spectacular Deliverance in which there is

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
