





For as long as we draw breath ... we can serve God





"Servant of the Lord" ... no grander moniker than that


They bury Joshua in hill country of Ephraim, north of Mount Gaash.







Rev. J. B. Wentworth closed ...


Earlier periods ... well employed ... honor and a good name ... crown our character when our locks shall be silvered over with the frosts of time....




As they stand upon the last verge of time, their spirits catch fresh inspiration from their nearness to the other world....

930 - Israel crowns Jeroboam King at Shechem

DIVIDED KINGDOMS

- Kingdom of Israel to north
- Kingdom of Judah to south

Northern Kings of Israel moved to Tirzah

... Then to Samaria ...

722 B.C. – North into Captivity

Return ... Shechem Capital of Samaria



Gen 12:6 – Abraham arrives in Shechem @ 75 yrs old
Lord appears to him at Shechem – 1st Altar

Gen 33 – after Jacob returned from Padam-Aram

Jacob buys property around Shechem

Shechem was also the name of the prince

Gen 34 – Shechem rapes Dinah ...

then he wants to marry her ...

Her brothers Simeon & Levi plot revenge

They talk Shechem & company to be circumcised

3 days later—still hurting— Simeon & Levi kill all the males

Other brothers looted the city



Joshua follows Moses in Deuteronomy
Joshua takes up "Servant of Lord" after Moses
Joshua – after Jericho and Ai partial conquest
Joshua 8 – Joshua had gathered the Israelites
for their FIRST covenant renewal

On Mt. Ebal Joshua had built an Altar
People were before Mt. Ebal & Mt. Gerizim
Joshua read the Whole Law
THEN Joshua proceeds to TAKE the land ...
North, South, East, West – then divide land
Reuben, Gad, half-Manasseh go HOME ...



23:1-16 After Long Time, Joshua's Farewell: Love God

1-3 After a LONG TIME HAD PASSED and the LORD had given Israel REST from all their enemies around them

Joshua ... very old ... summoned all Israel—elders, leaders, judges and officials—and said to them: "I am very old."

- ✓ You yourselves have seen everything the LORD your God has done to all these nations for your sake...
- 4 Remember ... allotment ... how Lord fought for you
- √ 6-7 "Be very strong; be careful to obey all that is written in the Book of the Law of Moses ... NOT turning to the right or to the left. Don't ... mess with nations ... or their gods
- √ 8 Hold fast to the LORD your God, as you have until now...
- √ 11 So be very careful to love the LORD your God.

23:1-16 After Long Time, Joshua's Farewell: Love God

- 12-13 "But if you turn away and
- ✓ ally yourselves with the survivors of these nations ...
- ✓ and intermarry ...
- ✓ then Lord will not longer "drive out" nations
- ✓ Instead, nations will "snares and traps" for you
- ✓ perish from this good land, which the LORD your God has given you.





23:14-16 "I go the way of all the earth"—God Kept ALL His Promise

14 "Now I am about to go the way of all the earth.

You know with all your heart and soul that not one of all the good promises the LORD your God gave you has failed.

Every promise has been fulfilled; not one has failed.

Joshua ... somber ... serious ...

Here's a fine quote from Fifty Years and Beyond, p. 184

"If we have a home to shelter us, and friends have been gathered by our firesides, then the rough places of wayfaring will have been worn and smoothed away in the twilight of life.... Happy, indeed, are those ... the world has not changed the tone of their holier feelings, or broken the musical chords of the heart, whose vibrations are so melodious, so touching to the evening of age."



24:1-13 Joshua Calls a Convention

- ¹ Then Joshua assembled all the tribes of Israel at Shechem. He summoned the elders, leaders, judges and officials of Israel....
- ²⁻¹¹ Joshua gives History Preview
 - Abraham who lived beyond the Euphrates
 - ✓ Jacob ... then to Egypt
 - ✓ Moses and Aaron ... crossing Red Sea Life
 - ✓ Moses and YOU in wilderness
 - ✓ Moab fights ... God forces Balaam to bless Israel
 - ✓ You cross the Jordan ... take Jericho
 - ✓ Then God helps with the Amorites, Perizzites,
 Canaanites, Hittites, Girgashites, Hivites and Jebusites



24:1-13 Joshua Calls a Convention

12 I sent the hornet ahead of you ... drove them out before you ... You did not with your own sword and bow.

¹³ So I gave you a land on which you did not toil and cities you did not build; and you live in them and eat from vineyards and olive groves that you did not plant.'

I'll tell you what—HORNETS will get one running!

Exodus 23:28 foretold, "I will send the HORNET ahead of you to drive the Hivites, Canaanites and Hittites out of your way."

Deut. 7:20 also foretold, Moreover, the LORD your God will send the HORNET among them until even the survivors who hide from you have perished.

24:14-15 The Example Set – Me & My House—We Will Serve God

¹⁴ "Now fear the LORD and serve him with all faithfulness. Throw away the gods your ancestors worshiped beyond the Euphrates River and in Egypt, and serve the LORD.

¹⁵ But if serving the LORD seems undesirable to you, then choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve, whether

- 1. gods your ancestors served beyond the Euphrates, or
- 2. gods of the Amorites, in whose land you are living.

But as for me and my household, we will serve the LORD."

Those golden, stunning words of utter resolve ...

But as for me and my household, we will serve the LORD.

24:14-15 The Example Set – Me & My House—We Will Serve God

Notice first Joshua's charge ... CHOOSE:

- 1. gods your ancestors served beyond the Euphrates or
 - 2. gods of the Amorites, in whose land you are living

That is, beyond the Euphrates meant Pagans of Ur, Pagans surrounding former home of Abraham

That is, "gods of Amorites" were Pagans gods of Canaan

CHOOSE ... almost like Joshua was giving up ...

- ✓ Some say, like reverse psychology ...
- ✓ Some say, like a sarcasm ... go forth if yee be an idiot!

Perhaps like both, I suspect Senior Citizen Joshua was a tad tired

If his LIFE & last 80+ years was not enough - GO YOUR WAY!



24:16-18 The People's Reflection – After ALL God's Done—We Too

¹⁶ People answered, "Far be it from us to forsake the LORD to serve other gods!

Then the people parrot Joshua ...

¹⁷⁻¹⁸ It was the LORD our God himself who brought us and our parents up out of Egypt ... drove out before us all the nations

We too will serve the LORD, because he is our God.

Nice to know ... hope it is so ...

Pray it is so ...

yet, Joshua WAS 100 years old ... he was no fool ...
Joshua has HEARD such many, many, many times before
How quickly a young man will parrot an older one

24:16-18 The People's Reflection – After ALL God's Done—We Too

A quote from *Fifty Years & Beyond*, page 212, by last pastor of the Central Presbyterian Church in Brooklyn, New York, before it burned down in 1872 the Rev. Dr. Thomas De Witt Talmage (1832-1902)

"The Grandeur of Old Age"

Blessed old age, if you let it come naturally.

The grandest things in all the universe are old.

Old mountains; old rivers; old seas; old stars; and old eternity.

Then do not be ashamed to be old, unless you are older than the mountains, and older than the seas.



24:19-20 A Somber Warning – If you Abandon God, He'll Destroy You

¹⁹ But Joshua told the people, "You will not be able to worship the Lord, because He is a holy God. He is a jealous God; He will not remove your transgressions and sins.

²⁰ If you abandon the Lord and worship foreign gods, He will turn against you, harm you, and completely destroy you, after He has been good to you."

One of the hardest verses in the Bible to clarify definitively

"You will NOT be able to worship the Lord"

Among meanings,

- ✓ perhaps best is Joshua simply referred to Absolute Holiness
- ✓ They still NEEDED a priesthood ...
- ✓ Kingdom of God still looked for Messiah

24:21-28 Get Rid of Foreign Gods, Records in Book of Law, Stone Set

- ²¹ But the people said to Joshua, "No! We will serve the LORD."
- ^{24:22-28} Very well, then, Joshua said, "THEY WERE WITNESSES"
 - ✓ Charged them to "throw away the foreign gods"
 - Recorded these things in the Book of the Law of God
 - ✓ Set up a Stone under an Oak Tree near the Holy Place
 - Called "Matzevah" Sacred Pillar
 - Lot of these set up in Bible
 - ✓ Joshua dismissed them ...
 - ✓ Joshua's Last Farewell ...

What shall we make of it?



24:21-28 Get Rid of Foreign Gods, Records in Book of Law, Stone Set

Strangely enough ... the it was ILLEGAL to set up pillars: Lev. 26:1 "You shall not make idols for yourselves or erect an image or pillar, and you shall not set up a figured stone in your land to bow down to it, for I am the LORD your God."

Deut. 16:22, simply says, "You shall not set up for yourself a sacred pillar which the LORD your God hates."

Furthermore, Exod. 23:24, 34:13; Deut. 7:5, 12:3, 16:22— ALL the verses command Israel to "tear down their altars and dash in pieces their pillars."

As we saw in 1 Samuel,

Israelites did NOT follow ALL of the LAW ...

Not at ANY time from Moses to the return from exile, 538 B.C. So those folks who want to go back to the O.T. really do NOT!

24:21-28 Get Rid of Foreign Gods, Records in Book of Law, Stone Set

Ten Commandments seemed to be hard enough ...

Judaism did not KICK into high gear until AFTER return from Exile, 538 B.C.

When Ezra & Nehemiah rebuilt the Temple, returning exiles OBEYED like never before

1400 B.C. Israelites were VERY Tribal ...

1000 B.C. King David unites Israel ... still

LAW was loose in 1400 B.C.

Israelites relied more on *LEADERSHIP*

Israelites leaned to the DYNAMISM of God's Word

God WORKED through Moses, Joshua, Judges, Prophets & David

³¹ Israel served the LORD THROUGHOUT the lifetime of Joshua and of the elders who outlived him and who had experienced everything the LORD had done for Israel.

Joshua left a Legacy of Leadership ...

His CONVICTION caught hold ...

His VALUES became THEIR values ... at least for one generation ...

Loved God THROUGHOUT the lifetimes of Joshua and elders



Joshua's Last Days ...

I cannot think or imagine anything greater

Than believing, hoping ...

wishing ... dreaming ...

desiring with all my heart ...

than believing that those I LOVED

FOLLOWED diligently after

MY VALUES ...

That ... for a generation after me ... those I loved *LOVED* what I Loved ...

Best of all, it was recorded in the Bible ...
treasured for as long as this old earth survives

THAT is all any parent or leader could ask ...

Rather—ahhh ... correction ... in better words ...

That is all any "Servant of the Lord" ever wants

I've known several pastors who left in a HURRY ...

I've seen several pastors LEAVE in a rush ... "God's Call" so they say ... as they grab their severance and run

Some pastors left running ... Fallen from Grace

Nixon Resigned because ... he was caught conniving





Joshua's Legacy of Leadership ... recorded forever

Not so with Joshua ...

Joshua had no "Bug Out Bag"

Joshua had ZERO plans on leaving Israel ...

Besides NO PLACE to go ... never DREAMED of leaving

In fact and truth ... for him, there in 1400 B.C.

No Greater Station in Life

While we have trouble with a LOT of things way back when ... for Joshua, he was the undisputed leader by WORK, by LIVING

He was HOME ... and had worked hard for Israel

He was HOME ... and LOVED his people

Joshua was passing the baton of his LIFE & how he LIVED

What better epitaph for anyone ...


