In case you did not notice, see the inscription: For the choir director. A Maskil of the sons of Korah. **On Psalm 32**, we visited the inscrutability of Maskil – **Aug 13 On Psalm 84, we visited the lineage of the Sons of Korah** – July 2 11 Psalms to the Sons of Korah 42-49, 84, 85, 87 (88? or Heman) 13 Psalms called a Maskil: 32, 42, 44, 45, 52-55, 74, 78, 88, 89, 142 **Deep Calls unto Deep**

There a few things you do NOT want find in the DEEP

Do NOT Try This At Home Of course, do face your inner demons Deep Calls unto Deep **Most of the Iceberg is UNDER the water**

We LIVE on the surface, face to face

A Maskil of the sons of Korah. **KJV to the Chief Musician – NIV Choir Director = expert in music** "Maskil" = MASS-kill = Root of Maskil is translated "Instruct" Septuagint or LXX, the Greek O.T. c. 200 B.C. & beyond translates Maskil as "ability of comprehension" Latin Vulgate translates Maskil as Maskil "understanding" or "intelligence" refers to **One:** a Psalm of wisdom, understanding, teaching *(WORDS or*) **Two:** a skillful, artistic music composition or song *MUSIC* **Deep Calls unto Deep**



Spurgeon, 1885 trying kind as David's was. by Alexander Melville It is always edifying to listen to the experience of a thoroughly gracious and much AFFLICTED SAINT. Hate to tell you all this ... if you've had very little AFFLICTION Psalm 42 will NOT mean as much


A Maskil of the Sons of Korah ... Korah was the Great-Grand son of Levi **Original Head of the Levites** Third son of Jacob & Leah ... **Ex. 6:16, Korah died at 137** Num. 16 ... something else happens

Num. 16, Korah LED Dathan, Abiram and 250 "chiefs" ... "well-known men" in a rebellion against Moses Korah believed MOSES to be unholy! **Bad news for Korah ...** Moses prayed ... set up a test ... Earth swallows Korah, Dathan, Abiram and all they possessed ... God sent FIRE to burn up the other 250

Numbers 26:9-11 – Sons of Korah are NOT involved in the rebellion of their father

1 Chron 9:19-20 – sons of Korah were

GATEKEEPERS "responsible for guarding the thresholds of the tent just as their ancestors ... of to the dwelling of the LORD."

2 Chron 20:19, we see them LEADING in song as Jehoshaphat invades Moab

AFTER the exile, Ezra & Nehemiah appoint two choirs after "David & Asaph"

This is NOT the picture!


¹ As a deer *LONGS* for streams of water, so I long for You, God.



KJV - As the hart PANTETH after the water brooks, so panteth my soul after thee, O God. The DEER has NOT FOUND the peaceful brook yet Spurgeon* eloquently says, As after a long drought the poor fainting hind LONGS for the streams, or rather as the hunted hart instinctively SEEKS after the river to lave its smoking flanks and to escape the dogs,

even so my weary, persecuted soul PANTS after the Lord my God.

Spurgeon* said of Psalm 42, When a man comes to tears, constant tears, plenteous tears, tears that fill his cup and trencher, he is in earnest indeed. As the big tears stand in the stag's eyes in her distress, so did the salt drops glitter in the eyes of David.

Spurgeon* said of Psalm 42, David's appetite was gone, his tears not only seasoned his meat, but became his only meat, he had no mind for other diet. well for him that the heart could open the safety valves: there is a dry grief far more terrible than showery sorrows.

Refrain Put your hope in God, "Burden" for I will still praise Him, my Savior and my God. Bible Scholar Albert Barnes calls it the first "Burden or Refrain" vs. 5 is repeated in 42:11 ... Psalm 42 has 2 Stanzas w 2 Refrains In other words, verses 42:5 and 42:11 are repeated in 43:5 ... **Psalm 43 could be the THIRD Stanza w Refrain of Psalm 42** Read Psalms 42 & 43 ... they do go nicely together • if 42 & 43 are ONE, refrain above is repeated three times 42:5 - 42:11 - 43:5

Easy to see one interpretation ... from the heights of Mt. Hermon and the lower Mizar ... the rains cause rivers & waterfalls





KJV, NIV, ESV, NASB, HCSB—all—translate 42:7, Deep calls to Deep

Curiously ... my heroes Keil and Delitzsch translated 42:7
⁷ Flood calleth to flood at the sound of Thy cataracts, All Thy breakers and Thy billows have passed over me.
John I. Durham, *Broadman Comm.* translated 42:7
⁷ Deep calls to deep at the thunder of thy cataracts all thy waves and they billows have gone over me.
The KJV translates 42:7

⁷ Deep calleth unto deep at the noise of thy waterspouts: all thy waves and thy billows are gone over me

Keil and Delitzsch explain 42:7 ... the author, perhaps David **David beyond the Jordan at the foothills of Mt. Hermon ...** looks longingly west to Israel towards his home ... there, in a strange land, the wild waters of the awe-inspiring mountains roar around him, there seems to be a corresponding tumult in his soul.... he depicts the natural features of the country round about him ... high and magnificent waterfalls of the lake of Muzerb ... waterfall at the course of the Jordan near Paneas and the waters that dash headlong down the mountains round about

After the FIRST of two refrains in 42 ... or first of THREE if joined to 43 There begins ANOTHER lonely, plaintive cry in the night

- I suspect the HEART of Psalm 42 ... or even of 42 & 43 combined
 - is 42:7 surrounded by splendid images of heartache

Perhaps David ... yet we might be fortunate that we DON'T know I suspect I've asked one too many times ...

Have YOU been there?

Yet we have the depths of despair described like never before Fitting that we look to Spurgeon* on 42:7 ...

Thy severe dealings with me seem to excite all creation to attack me; heaven, and earth, and hell, call to each other stirring each other up in dreadful conspiracy against my peace.



Bible Scholar Albert Barnes* notes:

word rendered "deep" is תהום or *tehom* – means properly a wave, billow, surge, and then, a mass of waters; a flood – the deep; the sea

tehom is translated "sea" in several places ...

Barnes furthermore notes:



Albert Barnes (1798-1870) Great Prebyterian Theologian

The word "calleth," here means that one wave seemed to speak to another, or one wave responded to another.

Compare Psalm 19:2, "Day unto day uttereth speech."



Spurgeon* knows ... so it seemed to David that heaven and earth united to create a tempest around him. His woes were incessant and overwhelming. Billow followed billow, one sea echoed the roaring of another ... bodily pain aroused mental fear, Satanic suggestions chimed in with mistrustful forebodings, outward tribulation thundered in awful harmony with inward anguish: his soul seemed drowned as in a in a universal deluge of trouble, over whose waves the providence of the Lord moved as a watery pillar, in dreadful majesty inspiring the utmost terror.

Spurgeon* knows ... the afflicted one was like one on a lonely bark around which the fury of a storm is bursting, or a mariner floating on a mast, almost every moment submerged. All thy waves and thy billows are gone over me. David thought that every trouble in the world had met in him ... Atlantic rollers sweeping in ceaseless succession over one's head, waterspouts coming nearer and nearer, and all the ocean in uproar around the weary swimmer; for they have experienced the like.



Spurgeon* knows ... the afflicted soul ... most of the heirs of heaven can realise the description, for they have experienced the like. This is a deep experience unknown to babes in grace, but common enough to such as do business on the Great Waters of Affliction: to such it is some comfort to remember that the waves and billows are the Lord's ... they are all sent, and directed by him, and achieve his designs, and the child of God knowing this, is the more resigned.

As by a force of WILL ... I COMMAND my Soul to Hope in God

That closes Psalm 42 ...

or that closes the first two parts, with Psalm 43 the third part w Psalm 43:5 repeating the Refrain or "Burden" a third time
