



Charles H. Spurgeon "More than Conquerors" No. 751, May 19, 1867 – 8:37 They were men who knew the Love of Christ, Rested upon that Love as a man leaneth upon a staff ... They did not speak of Christ's Love as though a myth to be respected, a tradition to be reverenced; They viewed it as a blessed REALITY ... being persuaded that it would bear them up as upon eagles' wings ... resting assured ... a foundation of rock, against which the waves might beat, and the winds blow, but their soul's habitation stood securely upon it. El Capitan

Charles H. Spurgeon "More than Conquerors" No. 751, May 19, 1867 – 8:37 Love to Jesus was a flame which fed upon the very marrow of their bones, core and heart of their being; Therefore, from its own force burned its way into the outer man, and shone there. Zeal for the glory of King Jesus ... seal of genuine Christians. Because of their dependence upon Christ's Love they dared much ... they did much. Because of their reliance upon the love of Jesus they were not afraid of their enemies; El Capitan Charles H. Spurgeon "More than Conquerors" No. 751, May 19, 1867 – 8:37


Because of their Love to Jesus

Charles H. Spurgeon "More than Conquerors" No. 751, May 19, 1867 – 8:37 In every place the Christian was a speckled bird, because Love to Jesus would not allow the Christian to disguise his convictions; Christian ... everywhere a stranger ... Because the very language of his everyday life differed from that of his neighbors. Where others blasphemed, he adored; ... Where others girt on the sword, he resisted not evil; Where others were each man seeking his own ... Christian ... one whose treasure was in heaven ... Who set his affections upon things above.

Charles H. Spurgeon "More than Conquerors" No. 751, May 19, 1867 – 8:37

This Love to Jesus made the Christian a perpetual protestor against evil for the sake of Jesus.

It led him yet further—he became a constant witness to the truth ... so precious in his own soul.

Paul dreams of eternal life, and when he falls asleep,
He hears in a vision from a man of Macedonia
across the blue Aegean, entreating him,
"Come over and help us."

With the morning light Paul rises,







Romans 5:1-5 Justified with Benefits 5:3 Not only so, but we also glory in our sufferings, because we know that Suffering produces Perseverance; Let me FIRST call your attention to this "SUFFERING" Elsewhere in N.T. trans. "Tribulation," "Affliction," "Trouble" Covers a LOT of generally great trouble of soul and body Generally – word's root means a "constricting of ribs" You KNOW the feeling ... this word refers to any trouble **HURTS** you on the INSIDE ... badly **Injustices – Beatings – Griefs – Harassments**

Romans 5:1-5 Justified with Benefits

- 4 Perseverance, Character; and Character, HOPE.
- 5 And HOPE does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us.

HOPE through Suffering?

vv. 3-4 Suffering \rightarrow Perseverance \rightarrow Character \rightarrow HOPE ...

H. W. Beecher (1813-1887) preached on Romans 5:4

Son of great evangelist Lyman Beecher (1775-1863)


His sister, Harriet Beecher Stowe, wrote
abolitionist novel *Uncle Tom's Cabin* (1852).

1839, Second Presbyterian Church in Indianapolis grew it to the largest church in the city ...

1847, Plymouth Congregational Church in Brooklyn, NY

Became one of the most noted preachers in America

On Romans, 5:4: God's works do not come from His hand like coin from the mint....




H. W. Beecher (1813-1887) preached on Romans 5:4

No two leaves on the same tree are precisely alike; no two buds on one bush have the same unfolding, nor do they seek to have.


What if God commanded the flowers to come to Him, and the sunflower came bending low with shame because it was not a violet; and the violet should come striving to lift itself up to be like a sunflower;

and the rose, the whiteness of the lily:

and so each one, disdaining itself, should seek to grow into the likeness of the other?







www. 3-4 Suffering → Perseverance → Character → HOPE

Because we BELIEVE the Bible ... one MIGHT

Be tempted to see only psychology there


Bible is packed with psychology.

No doubt, "suffering" and how you deal it

Builds Character

No one doubts that ... now connect verses 3-4 to verse 1
We see a whole BOAT LOAD of more ...
"Suffering" builds character in ALL men and women
But THIS HOPE and THIS CHARACTER are of a higher order

CHARACTER that has Christian HOPE!

LOVE ... all the world knows SOME ...

Christian knows the highest LOVE and HOPE

Solely, Exclusively seen in Christian Heart

See again the majesty of verse 5






Death in Adam & Life in Christ

Paul continues on the Life in Christ ...











Romans 5:1 to 7:25 ... Dead to Sin, Alive to God 7:1-12 how we are released from Holy Law 7:14 We know that the law is spiritual; but I am unspiritual, sold as a slave to sin. 15-16 I do not understand what I do. For what I want to do I do not do, but what I hate I do. And if I do what I do not want to do, I agree that the law is good. 24 What a wretched man I am! Who will rescue me ... 25 Thanks be to God, who delivers me through Jesus Christ our Lord! So then, I myself in my mind am a slave to God's law, but in my sinful nature a slave to the law of sin. El Capitan



Romans 8:1 to 9:33 No Condemnation in Christ

8:1 Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus

8:2-17 essentially expounds in other words
the Law vs. the Spirit

8:18-27 explain the Future Glory

8:18 I consider that our present sufferings are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed in us.

8:28-34 All things Good to those who Love god

8:35-39 most beautiful ... exquisite passage



8:35-39 most beautiful ... exquisite passage

8:35 Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? ... Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword?

36 As it is written: "For your sake we face death all day long; we are considered as sheep to be slaughtered."

37 No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us.

38 For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers,

39 neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.



Romans 8:1 to 9:33 No Condemnation in Christ 9:1-33 as we saw with chapter 4 as history behind 3 Chapter 9 gives a history behind 8 Paul speaks the "truth" ... he wishes himself cursed To save his own people ... cause he loves them still Paul touches Rebekah, Isaac, Jacob, Moses and Pharaoh Then Paul brings up Hosea and Isaiah 9:33 As it is written: "See, I lay in Zion a stone that causes people to stumble and a rock that makes them fall, and the one who believes in him will never be put to shame." What great love God showed in history NOTHING can separate us from Love of God ... see ch 8 El Capitan

Romans 10:1-21 Whosoever Can Be Saved

Chapter 10 is a kind of conclusion from 8 & 9

10:4 Christ is the culmination of the law so that there may be righteousness for everyone who believes.

10:11 As Scripture says, "Anyone who believes in him will never be put to shame."

Paul follows this with more history in Isaiah ...

Israel is a tough tribe to lead to the Cross ...



Romans 11:1-36 Remnant & Root Saved

11:1-32 ... Root and Grafting Metaphor


Paul goes into detail ...

11:17 If some of the branches have been broken off, and you, though a wild olive shoot, have been grafted in among the others and now share in the nourishing sap from the olive root

11:33-36 Paul waxes poetic again in a doxology

33 Oh, the depth of the riches of the wisdom and knowledge of God!

How unsearchable his judgments, and his paths beyond tracing out!



Romans 12:1-21 Living Sacrifices & Love
Paul encourages to ACTION with Spiritual Gifts

12:1 Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship.

Less a list than in 1 Cor. 12 ... best of "Christian Character" here Softly, gently, Paul encourages to Love, Forgive, Be Kind 12:18 If it is possible, as far as it depends on you,

live at peace with everyone.

12:21 Do not be overcome by evil,

but overcome evil with good.



Romans 13:1-14 Love Fulfills the Law

After encouraging to work with authorities

Paul sums the Law = Love One Another

13:10 Love does no harm to a neighbor.

Therefore love is the fulfillment of the law.

13:12 The night is nearly over; the day is almost here. So let us put aside the deeds of darkness and put on the armor of light.

13:14 Rather, clothe yourselves with the Lord Jesus Christ, and do not think about how to gratify the desires of the flesh.



Romans 14:1-23 Respect the Weak

Be careful what you eat ...

Try not to become a stumbling block ...

Romans 15:1-13 Live in Harmony & Hope

15:1 We who are strong ought to bear with the failings of the weak and not to please ourselves.

Then ... in closing the Greatest Theology of the N.T.

15:18 I will not venture to speak of anything except what Christ has accomplished through me in leading the Gentiles to obey God by what I have said and done.

15:19-33 – Paul outlines his travel plans

16:1-26 - Paul greets many by NAME



Charles H. Spurgeon "Paul's Persuasion" No. 2492, Nov. 7, 1886 – 8:38-39

Paul was fully PERSUADED of this great truth.

Did he not learn it by revelation? ...

God was pleased to reveal it to him again and again, till his trembling heart was more and more PERSUADED

It may have seemed ... too good to be true ...

I have no doubt that Paul also argued with himself ...

the implantation of a living and incorruptible seed

which liveth and abideth for ever.

Christ spoke of it as the putting of a well into us





Charles H. Spurgeon "Paul's Persuasion" No. 2492, Nov. 7, 1886 – 8:38-39

He said, "The water that I shall give him shall be in him a well of water springing up into everlasting life."

As for my own convictions, I never can doubt it, I am fully PERSUADED concerning it.

This truth seems to have struck its roots into all the other truths of Scripture and twisted itself among the granite rocks which are the very foundation of our hope. I, too, am persuaded by a thousand arguments ... that NOTHING shall be able to separate us from the Love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.



Charles H. Spurgeon "Paul's Persuasion" No. 2492, Nov. 7, 1886 – 8:38-39

Paul summons all our foes, and sets them in battle array against us, and



when he has added up the total of all their legions, he says that he is persuaded that they shall not be able

— shall not be able, mark you, — to separate us from the

Love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.





Charles H. Spurgeon "Paul's Persuasion" No. 2492, Nov. 7, 1886 – 8:38-39

I have lately seen one or two of our friends almost in the very article of Death;
I think that they cannot long survive,
but I have come out from their bed-chamber greatly cheered by their holy peacefulness and joy.

I can see that death does not break the believer's peace;

Death seems rather to strengthen it.

I can see that there is no better place than the

Brink of Jordan, after all.





Charles H. Spurgeon "Paul's Persuasion" No. 2492, Nov. 7, 1886 – 8:38-39 I have seen the brethren, and the sisters, too, sit with their feet in the narrow stream, and they have been singing all the while. Death has not abated a single note of their song; nay, more, I have known some who are like the fabled swan which is said never to sing till it dies. Some of them who were heavy and sad of spirit in their days of health have grown joyous and glad as they have neared the eternal kingdom.

Charles H. Spurgeon "Paul's Persuasion" No. 2492, Nov. 7, 1886 – 8:38-39 Christ loved you when HE died; He will love you when YOU die. It was AFTER death — remember that, it was AFTER death that his heart poured out the tribute of Blood and Water ... There is nothing about death that makes Christ cease to Love us; Our bodies will be under his protection and care, and Our souls shall be with Christ, which is "far better" than being anywhere else.
